If anyone has not seen this paper, please let me know and I will arrange for a copy to be sent. Reading the note will, hopefully, allay many unsubstantiated fears which had been circulating. We also agreed on additional wording that now appears on the bottom of Vic's drivers' emails he sends out and again, I urge all drivers to read and take note of the committee's recommendations.

Although we have lost our Thursday afternoon Movement to Music class, the Tuesday exercise class goes from strength to strength with almost 45 'Guests' coming back after the summer holiday. We are trying to see if we can run an additional class given the class's popularity but finding a suitable and accessible venue and teacher are the difficult issues. Following **Bernard's** visit to Hope Corner Community Centre, Mays Lane we gave the Centre £500 to help expand some of their activities, and we are in discussions to get dialogue underway with the Centre on what other help we might possibly be able to give.

Although there are some conditions attached to this gift Bernard sees no problems in meeting these conditions when running future 'Guest' events, so we thank the trustees of The Hadley Trust for their generosity. Hopefully as we progress forward, we will build up a workable relationship with the Trust which can flourish.



Nearer home he assisted in the rescue of snowbound train passengers in the arctic Scotland of 1978 and witnessed the aftermath of the IRA bombings in Brighton and inner-city riots in Brixton and Toxteth. The descriptions of these often tragic and harrowing events are unforgettable.

**Bill Hamilton** has the eye of a true journalist, passionately committed to the truth, yet always humane and sympathetic. You will not be disappointed by joining **THE PUDDENECKS** to hear his talk which he has entitled 'Man on the Spot'
